### Dear friends,

We tend to have a negative association with the idea of religious commandments and laws. There is no doubt something to this. Laws have often been used as instruments of oppression. But then they are no longer laws serving truth, justice, and wisdom. In the bible, law is fundamentally about directing us to our true fulfilment as made in God's image. Whatever builds up our relationship to God, others, and crucially, the most vulnerable, is a law serving God's just purposes. This can never simply be about blindly following precepts. Law must be applied with discernment, diligence, and care. It must be written on our hearts and minds - indeed, it must express and enable the true purposes of our hearts and minds. Jesus addresses this head on in today's Gospel when the Pharisees challenge him and his disciples for not following the rules about washing their hands before eating. Jesus responds robustly, accusing these religious leaders of hypocrisy. They pretend to follow God's law, applying its strict letter, yet without any compassion or authenticity, failing to attend to the state of their own hearts and those in need. Jesus here relentlessly exposes the human tendency to make compliance with rules a measure of truth. This makes a mockery not just of God but of humanity as made in God's image. It reduces the truth about human life to a game of control of the strong over the weak, to ticking arbitrary boxes, rather than that of living beyond ourselves in the generous self-giving love that is the foundation of justice. God's law is radically counter-intuitive to our modern sensibility. It is not about suffocating restriction but freeing our hearts and minds from self-regard; to open them to beauty, goodness and truth; and to empower them for life-giving action, transformative thanksgiving, compassionate wisdom, and serving the common good. As today's epistle puts it, this is the law of liberty which demands not simply to be codified and enforced but enacted wholeheartedly in the flesh and bone of our lives to the benefit of all and the glory of God.
