Dear friends,

"Sticks and stones may break my bones / But words shall never hurt me." We say this to children as a form of encouragement against namecalling, to urge them not to listen to the hurtful things people say but rise above verbal abuse. And yet words do often hurt much more than sticks or stones. We witness this in the world of politics and the media, where the words of some politicians can quickly take on a deadly force, stirring up fear, prejudice, deceit, and violence. For a faith which affirms Jesus as the living Word of God made flesh, the Word crucified and risen, how Christians use words has a special significance. What we say and, perhaps even more so, how we say it matters. For we too must allow God's word to take flesh in us. This should challenge us. As indeed, the letter of James does today: "The tongue is a fire...no one can tame the tongue—a restless evil, full of deadly poison. With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse those who are made in the likeness of God. From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this ought not to be so." This expresses a core conviction about being human: that appropriate self-expression and communication, using the fragile medium of words, are vital for our freedom and fulfilment as intelligent, social, moral and embodied beings who depend on each other and whose hearts and minds reach for the transcendent. This conviction should challenge the notion that freedom is just saying what we like any way we want. Rather, we need daily to learn with others how to speak well, with truth, gentleness, compassion and love. This conviction also runs through our worship where we discover communally how to share words and silence in a way that opens us to the beauty, goodness and truth of God, humanity, and the world. Worship should inspire us to communicate as fully human beings. So, when we speak: do we hurt or build up; gossip or welcome; lie or serve truth; condemn or encourage; pre-judge or learn; silence or liberate, curse or bless? Do we let love's word take flesh?
