Dear friends,

Today is the feast of the angels. In the biblical world of the psalms, angels are spiritual beings who, like us, are created by God. They are pure spirits possessed of freedom, dignity, and purpose who, in faithfulness to God, reveal something of the true character of the spiritual reality that animates our lives. The life of the spirit, angels remind us, is where true strength, wisdom, joy, and freedom reside, but only insofar as we listen to and obey God's word of love and offer praise and thanksgiving to God on behalf of all creation. For spirits, angels and humans alike, are made to serve truth, celebrate justice, rejoice in worship, and reverence God in the beauty, goodness and truth of every creature. In an age and social context that often sees no value in the worship of God, it is little wonder that angels, like the spiritual meaning of being human, are dismissed as make-believe, albeit as sometimes a compelling form of escapism. Yet the mysterious and elusive nature of angels should surprise and recall us to the depth of the mystery of creation, of each person, and of the intimations that whisper to our imaginations and inspire us to reshape our material and historical world to purposes beyond narrow self-interest. To be serious about angel voices is to be serious about the dignity and value of the human vocation to discern what is good in all our works of creativity, exchanges, and encounters. For God calls humankind to consecrate time and place, history and culture, to God for the sake of the good of all. Such a fully human life of spiritual service is revealed in Christ, whom the angels serve; is guided and enabled by the Holy Spirit; and is shared by all the angels and saints whose song echoes in today's psalm (103.19-22): The Lord has established his throne in heaven, and his kingdom has dominion over all. Bless the Lord, you angels of his, you mighty ones who do his bidding and hearken to the voice of his word. Bless the Lord, all you his hosts, you ministers of his who do his will. Bless the Lord, all you works of his, in all places of his dominion; bless the Lord, O my soul.

New St George's Flag

The rather tattered flag of St George's flying outside the church was replaced last week with a new flag that includes the coat of arms of the Diocese of Chichester. Strictly speaking, as a matter of protocol, this should always be included on St George's flags flown by any Church of England church. This aligns with a warrant of the Earl Marshal dated 1938, which was requested by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York. Having the coat of arms is not simply about being compliant, however. It makes a statement that the St George's flag is not being flown simply as a national symbol, one that has, for some, an ambiguous association given its use by the far-right. The coat of arms more directly connects the flag to the Christian heritage of the nation, and the Christian message of God's love as revealed on the cross. This month we welcome The Revd Canon Bruce Ruddock, his talk is titled Roman Reflections. Ordained in 1983 he served his title in the parish of Felpham & Middleton-on-Sea followed by curacy at St Mary's, Portsmouth, then Vicar at St Michael's Barnes, Southwest London. In 1995 the Archbishop of Canterbury appointed Canon Bruce as his representative at the Vatican and Director of the Anglican Centre in Rome. In 1999, he became Canon Precentor at Worcester cathedral and then at Peterborough Cathedral. Until his retirement last year, Bruce was Chaplain at Chichester Cathedral.
