Dear friends,

The psalm for today's celebration of All Saints links the notion of sainthood with seeing the world in a different light. As the psalm says, The earth is the Lord's and all that fills it, the compass of the world and all who dwell therein. For he has founded it upon the seas and set it firm upon the rivers of the deep. Who shall ascend the hill of the Lord, or who can rise up in his holy place? Those who have clean hands and a pure heart, who have not lifted up their soul to an idol, nor sworn an oath to a lie; they shall receive a blessing from the Lord, a just reward from the God of their salvation.' Such is the company of those who seek him, of those who seek your face, O God of Jacob. (Psalm 24.1-6). To affirm, as the psalmist does, that God creates and sustains all things is to celebrate how everything depends on and reveals the glory of God in its unique existence, in the mysterious depths of what it is. For each thing distinctively declares that it is a gift of God's own being, truly given away, yet ever connected to God and so to everything else. This is to go beyond valuing things and people simply in how they serve our narrow interests. When we ascend the heights of this vision, paradoxically we do not see God as some special or different thing. Rather we see and interact with all things differently, especially our fellow humans. To embody this vision in our lives is the essence of being a saint, which is another way of saying living interdependently in a fully human manner. To come close to God, therefore, rather than separating us from others means to live ever more fully with others and for others, in the cause of championing humanity and the dignity of each person. Embolden by God's love revealed in Jesus Christ, this means opening our hearts and hands to the plight of others with compassion, joy, gentleness, and a thirst for justice and friendship. This is to seek out the face of God, in our time and in our place, as one of the company of the human race.
