Dear friends,

As Christmas approaches, with all the festive traditions and images of the season filling our schedules, we would do well to pause and consider how unlike the actual Christmas story much of this. Jesus, the word of God made flesh, is born into a poor family during a time of military occupation and religious tension in their homeland. Mary and Joseph, Jesus' family, are humble, faithful people yet deeply vulnerable. Their future uncertain. Indeed, soon after Jesus' birth they become refugees to escape persecution and death at the hands of a tyrant. What is striking, and beyond all sentimentality, is just how profoundly these simple and poignant details of the Christmas story speak to the lives of so many people in our country and in our world. And how it is to ones such as these that God shows a special concern. In this spirit, I would like to commend to you this year's Christian Aid Christmas appeal which is seeking to raise funds to support people in South Sudan where over one-third of the population are displaced. By many measures, South Sudan is the poorest country in the world with high infant mortality and low levels of education. For most people, simply meeting their basic daily needs is a challenge, something further impacted by the devasting effects of climate change. All this has been made critically worse, moreover, by the outbreak of war in neighbouring Sudan and the additional wave of refugees and returnees. Christian Aid works in the Wedweil Refugee Settlement in South Sudan, with their partner, Smile Again Africa Development Organisation (SAADO), to offer lifesaving support to thousands of displaced and vulnerable people. Though the UN World food programme provides basic rations, Christian Aid's financial assistance means people can buy nutritious food for themselves and their families to protect them from malnutrition and ill health as well as vital medicine, blankets, and other essential supplies. Stewardship Campaign - Planned Giving

A thank you too to everyone who responded positively to this year's Stewardship Campaign and reflected on giving both 'time and talents', and financial support. Alison Davies, our PCC Treasurer, has confirmed that we are forecast to receive an additional £5,600 from planning giving for next year. This represents approximately an 11% increase in planned giving. This is such encouraging news. The extra funds will give a vital boost to our finances, especially given that several key donors died or moved away last year, the rises in costs, and the extra maintenance work to the church building. The increase will help us to invest more in crucial mission and ministry, and, importantly, allow us to contribute more to Parish Share, the amount the Diocese asks each parish to pay to cover the cost of having a priest, training new priests, and central diocesan and Church of England costs. The PCC will be meeting after the service today to agree next year's annual budget and decide our pledge towards Parish Share.

Stewardship Campaign – Time And Talents

Sam Kelly and Fr Angus are currently in the process of reviewing everyone's responses to the Time and Talent questionnaire that formed part of the Stewardship Campaign. After Christmas, they will be in touch with those who expressed in an interest in volunteering in the different areas of church life. They will also reflect on the helpful comments that we made. Thank you again to everyone who contributes to making St George's a flourishing community.
